In 2022 the National Geodetic Survey (NGS) will replace NAD 83 and NAVD 88 with new horizontal and vertical reference systems: North American Terrestrial Reference Frame of 2022 (NATRF2022) and North American-Pacific Geopotential Datum of 2022 (NAPGD2022). These changes will have significant effects on surveying, mapping and GIS across Wisconsin.

Notes on Name and Logo



The original name of "NATRF2022 Task Force" was broadened to "WSRS2022" (Wisconsin Spatial Reference System 2022 Task Force) to extend the scope of the Task Force to include NAPGD2022 (North American-Pacific Geopotential Datum of 2022) which will replace NAVD 88.

Update on Discovery Team response to NGS

The Discovery Team responded to a Federal Register Notice deadline of August 31, 2018, for public commentary on the policies and procedures to update the State Plane Coordinate System (SPCS). A webinar is scheduled for March 7, 2019 to review responses. NGS received 41 unique responses from 97 organizations, with 23 states, 10 Native American tribes, and 1 national agency represented.

Focus Group organization and meeting schedules are up to the discretion of the Groups themselves.

Focus Group Roles

The main method to be used for communication and tracking of Focus Group activities is the "List of Goals and Deliverables". Each Focus Groups should create and maintain their own such list. The list will include all goals or deliverables the Focus Groups considers to be important to meet its objectives – including reports, recommendations, presentations, etc. Each goal/deliverable should have a due date.

Each Focus Group's list will evolve over time. It is not intended that the document will be static. Initially, it may be a very short list, but it will grow over time.

Goals/deliverables that have been met should be marked as "complete" in the list, rather than being deleted. This will serve as a way to document what has been accomplished and when.

Spreadsheet software such as MS Excel or Google Sheets might be used to maintain the list. The document can be shared on the shared drive to allow all members of the Focus Group to maintain it.

The list will be used to report on the status and activities of the Focus Groups at quarterly meetings. With the aid of the list, other Focus Group and Task Force members will be able to make suggestions or identify areas of common interest.

Focus Group Deliverables

To keep things moving, we (the Task Force Chairs) propose that all Focus Groups complete the following by the end of the 1st quarter (March 29, 2019):

- A list of all members of the Focus Group.
- A list of the Chair and any other officers, if applicable.
- An initial list of goals and deliverables.
